Our Goals:

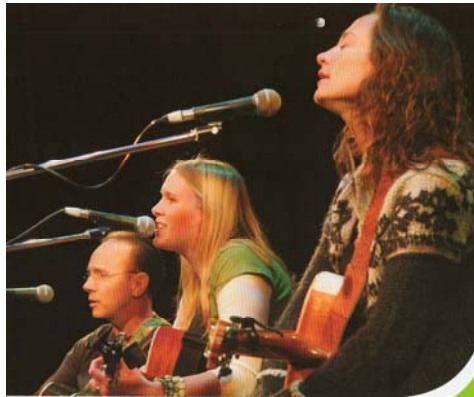
- Inform the public on matters of housing and homelessness

The Housing Issue

Thousands of people in Edmonton have no place to call home.

They are struggling on the streets, setting up camps in the river valley, have no warm place to sleep other than emergency shelters, or are crashing wherever and for as long as they can, sometimes in dangerous or unhealthy environments.

Tens of thousands of others have housing that is too expensive, insecure, or inadequate for their needs: they live on the brink of becoming homeless themselves.

Research clearly shows that there are substantial economic and social benefits when people have decent housing. While there are many facets to housing insecurity in Edmonton, there is only one basic reality:

The solution to homelessness is to provide appropriate housing for every person who needs it.

ECOHH believes that Edmontonians should be able to live in safe, affordable housing throughout our city and, when needed, access support that will help keep them housed.

ECOHH's History

The Edmonton Coalition on Housing and Homelessness (ECOHH) was created in 1986. Many non-profit agencies that offer housing or support services continue to be active participants. These frontline providers are not only critical players in solving the housing problem, but also caring advocates for those people who are most vulnerable.

In 1987, ECOHH produced a report called "No Place Like Home" that recommended immediate action to prevent what many saw as an impending housing crisis.

In the 1990s, ECOHH established both the Edmonton Housing Trust Fund and the Edmonton Joint Planning Committee on Housing. Both entities merged to form Homeward Trust as part of a long-term initiative to provide quality affordable housing in Edmonton by investment in housing units and support services.

Each year, ECOHH sponsors and organizes the HomeFest folk festival (since 2003) and the Homeless Memorial gathering (since 2005) to raise awareness of the impact of homelessness in Edmonton.
